

Beer Destinations 3Southern Maine Edition

Love craft beer? Want to find out where it's made? Looking for new brews that you've heard or read about? Well here's an opportunity to find out about all of these things and more!

his is the third of a series of articles providing information about what I refer to as 'Beer Destinations' and will give you a bit of knowledge about multiple brewery spots in the greater New England area. In this series, I will try to select a number of breweries to travel to in one trip where you can sample their offerings, move on to the next, and manage to hit them all if you're up for the challenge...

There are a BUNCH of great breweries out there making terrific beer just for you! I live in New Hampshire, but in this issue, we will focus on southern Maine and its

plentiful beer production along this coastal region.

There are over 90 breweries in Maine alone with that number increasing every year. The term 'brewery' refers to a nano or micro brew-on-premise establishment (usually with food), tap or tasting room, or even a macro brewery, such as the likes of Budweiser.

The Southern Maine area has a cluster of awesome brewers churning out such great beer. The best way to approach finding these great breweries is to travel from south to north, so this article will outline each location as if you were traveling by car northward, from Kittery to Portland.

Kittery

• Tributary Brewing Company, 10 Shapleigh Road, Kittery, was founded in 2014 by brewing legend Todd Mott who helped make Portsmouth Brew-



ery famous in the 1990's. tasting Their shares room large glass windows that allow visitors a glimpse of the 20 barrel brewery. Flights and growlers are for sale as

well as light food. Their

motto says it all; One Tributary Leads To Another.

• Woodland Farms Brewery, 306 US Rt 1, Kittery, is conveniently located near the Kittery Outlets and is a 3 barrel brewery and 50 seat tasting room. They pride themselves on small batch lagers and sours. Coming from a family tradition of dairy farming, cows can still be found close by but their focus today is making loyal fans with awesome beers. York

• The York River Landing, 150 US Rt 1, York, caters to the discerning visitor who wants both good food and great beers and wine. With 36 taps, you will need to make this a stop every time you pass through the area. Their website has all of their food menu items,

• SoMe Brewing Company, 1 York

Street, York, is a father-son collaboration which began in 2013 with a small pilot brewing system. They are now at a 15 barrel capacity to produce some great recipes. Their Crystal Persuasion double IPA and Apostrophe IPA are real crowd pleasers.

Wells

• Hidden Cove Brewing, 73 Mile Road, Wells, produces well crafted beers available in both 12 oz cans and 22 oz bottles and distributed around Maine and NH. They offer year round, seasonal and barrel aged selections which makes your purchase options

Kennebunk

• Federal Jack's Restaurant and Brew Pub, 8 Western Ave, Kennebunk, offers great food choices

while you relax with ocean views and great beers and fine wines. The name stems back from one of the most famous sailing ships built nearby in the early 1900's. But since 1992, they brewed their own craft beer on prem-

ises. Demand quickly outnumbered their ability and Shipyard Brewing Company was started in Portland. See their website, www.federaljacks.com

- Banded Horn Brewing, 32 Maine Street, Biddeford, set up their brew space with a 150 year old mill building. With over 15 beers to their claim to fame including Daikaiju double IPA (amazing!!!), Banded Horn is helping put Maine on the New England beer scene in a big way. 
lish brewing traditions to bring a refreshingly different beer offerings to its admiring public. This location is one of seven within Maine and Florida.



Conceived originally at Federal Jack's, Shipyard grew out of demand for great beer and Shipyard was opened in 1994. • Peak Organic Brewing Company, 110 Marginal Way #802, Portland, finishes our destination tour in a big way because it is one of the most widely

known and distributed breweries in New England. With a focus on freshness and quality ingredients, Peak will be well worth the trip. Their IPA's are especially unique and full flavored, winning award after award. Visit them at peakbrewing.
