

o you love craft-brewed beer? Want to find out more about it and where it's made? Lookingfor new brews that you've heard or read about? Well here's an opportunity to find out about all of these things and more!

This is the fourth of a series of articles providing information about what I refer to as 'Beer Destinations' and will give you a bit of knowledge about multiple brewery spots in the greater New England area. In this series, I will try to select a number of breweries to travel to in one trip where you can sample their offerings, move on to the next, and manage to hit them all if you're up for the challenge...

There are a TON of awesome breweries out there making terrific beer just for you! I live in New Hampshire, but there are just so many great breweries located in Vermont, I've decided to concentrate on the Burlington brewer's mecca as your Beer Destination in this issue. Also included here are some of the best eateries while you quench your thirst.

In 2015, Vermont was ranked #1 in the country for the most craft breweries per capita.

Another way to look at this statistic is the amount of population vs breweries. And they are ahead of both Maine and NH in beer production for the population. So there are about 675,000 people living in Vermont, but the 21 and older populous are offered almost 17.5 gallons per person; that's more than any other state in the union!

On your way over Rt 89 heading north westward, you will come upon the following towns and cities that contain quite popular breweries. Here are some of the best according to their notoriety...

ALCHEMIST

100 Cottage Club Road, Stowe, VT

On your way to Burlington, you'll see signs for Stowe; take the exit and look up the Alchemist Brewery to find some of the most coveted of Vermont's beers. If you are after their flagship beer, Heady Topper, good luck getting it since it is always in short supply. But if you are lucky enough to find it for sale, you are only allowed 1-2 four packs. This is what to expect from this enterprising brewery.
